2. IAHS launches Decade of Prediction of Ungauged Basins (PUBs)

There is a need for hydrological data where ground-based observations are missing. PUBs is an international research initiative that will combine theoretical hydrology, remote sensing, in-situ observations and modelling of the quantity and quality of hydrological phenomena in order to predict the stream flow in basins with no records. This information is urgently needed for use in water resources development and management, flood forecasting, and for many other purposes. 4. Prof. I.I. Mueller receives AGU Waldo Smith award

Dr. Ivan I. Mueller, Professor of Ohio State University and past president (1987-1991) of the International Association of Geodesy (IAG), has been awarded the 2002 Waldo E. Smith award from the American Geophysical Union. He is cited for pioneering the interdisciplinary science of modern satellite geodesy; for developing fundamental theory and practical realization of the terrestrial reference frame using emerging satellite geodetic measurement systems, and for extraordinary leadership to foster collaborative international scientific research programs and to provide services for the advancement of geophysical science, including the initiation and establishment of such important scientific services as the International GPS Service for Geodynamics (IGS).
