1. Season's Greetings



2. IUGG Membership and Financial Situation 2022

As of 1 January 2022, IUGG has 73 National Members including 58 countries in paying status. The paying members are placed in categories from 1 to 14 depending on their financial contribution to the Union (the membership dues rise with increasing category number). At present, the highest category used is category 11. The members pay dues according to the number of units assigned to their category (in category 1 the number of units is 1, and in category 11 the number is 35). The XXII IUGG General Assembly (Boulder, USA, 1995) decided that the price of 1 unit is determined annually using an inflator index obtained from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. In 2022, the price of 1 unit will be US\$2,195. The 58 paying members represent a total of 277 units, which is equivalent to a total income of US\$608,015. The funds received as dues are the basis for IUGG's operations as a scientific union, although Union Associations may also have their own funds earned through book sales, donations, or other means. The funds are spent to support: (i) scientific activities of Union Associations and Commissions; (ii) international scientific programs, projects and services; (iii) general and scientific assemblies, symposia, workshops, and schools; (iv) the IUGG Grants Program; (v) the International Lithosphere Program; (vi) the International Science Council; (vii) travel of students, early career scientists, and scientists from developing countries to attend scientific meetings; and (viii) administration and management.

5. International Year of Basic Sciences for Sustainable Development 2022


On 2 December 2021, the United Nations General Assembly proclaimed 2022 as the International Year of Basic Sciences for Sustainable Development (IYBSSD 2022).

The IYBSSD 2022 will focus on the links between basic sciences and the <u>Sustainable Development Goals</u>. It was proposed by a consortium of international scientific unions and scientific organisations including IUGG, led by the International Union of Pure and Applied Physics (<u>IUPAP</u>). With this <u>resolution</u>, the United Nations General Assembly "invites all [its] Member States, organisations of the United



Nations system and other global, regional and subregional organisations, as well as other relevant stakeholders, including academia, civil society, inter alia, international and national nongovernmental organisations, individuals and the private sector, to observe and raise awareness of the importance of basic sciences for sustainable development, in accordance with national priorities". IUGG is delighted to be a founding partner of the IYBSSD. Science within the remit of IUGG is a close match to the Sustainable Development Goals (see <u>Mapping IUGG to Sustainable Development Goals</u>), so we can look forward to making a major contribution, through our own activities and in liaison with other organisations, to addressing the goals and celebrating the achievements of the International Year.

6. ISC News on Disaster Risk Reduction



The International Science Council (ISC) published the Global Risk Perceptions Report 2021, which reports about the global risk perceptions of leaders from business, economics, and government. The publication aims to contribute to the discourse that has been shaped through the respective work of the World Economic Forum and to spark dialogue, identify knowledge gaps, and support the growth of a multisectoral scientific community working to better understand and provide solutions to global risks.

ISC also published <u>A Framework for Global Science in Support of Risk-informed Sustainable Development and Planetary Health</u>. This document takes stock of recent developments in disaster risk science and provides a compelling set of directions for research and scientific collaboration for

a more holistic and collaborative approach to understanding and managing risks.

8. Meeting Announcements

8th IAGA/ICMA/SCOSTEP Workshop on Vertical Coupling in the Atmosphere-Ionosphere System



The 8th IAGA/ICMA/SCOSTEP Workshop on Vertical Coupling in the Atmosphere-Ionosphere System (VCAIS2022) will take place at the Institute of Earth Physics and Space Science in Sopron, Hungary from 11 to 15 July 2022. Due to the ongoing pandemic, the workshop will be conducted as a hybrid meeting where scientists from abroad, who may still have travel difficulties, will have the possibility to participate online.

The workshop aims to discuss the principal mechanisms of vertical coupling processes in the Earth's atmosphere. It will focus on dynamical,

electrodynamical, and chemical processes that drive coupling events between the neutral atmosphere, the ionosphere, and the magnetosphere. We invite papers dealing with experiments, modelling, data analyses, and theoretical aspects that describe the effects of coupling processes within the atmosphere-ionosphere-magnetosphere system. The abstract submission deadline is *1 May 2022*.

2nd World Conference on Meteotsunamis

The <u>2nd World Conference on M</u> <u>eteotsunamis</u> will take place in Menorca, Balearic Islands, Spain, from 18 to 20 May 2022.

Meteotsunamis are atmospherically generated long-ocean waves in the tsunami frequency band. The amplitude reached in many ports and coasts around the world is occasionally large enough to produce significant damage.

The 1st World Conference on Meteotsunamis was held in Split, Croatia in 2019. After the success of that event (see the <u>special issue</u> of *Natural Hazards* devoted to the Conference) it was decided to continue such meetings.

Therefore, the aim of the 2nd World Conference on Meteotsunamis is to deepen, extend and share knowledge on scientific, technical and societal aspects of meteotsunamis. Submissions concerning all aspects are highly welcome. Menorca has been chosen to host the event because the inlet of Ciutadella, located on the west coast of the island, is a world-wide meteotsunami hot spot.

The conference will be organised by the Institut Menorquí d'Estudis (IME), Consell Insular de Menorca (Conselleria de Medi Ambient) and the Universitat de les Illes Balears (UIB), with the support and funding of the following institutions: IUGG-IAPSO, the Government of Balearic Islands,

the Ciutadella de Menorca City Hall, the Balearic Island Coastal Observing and Forecasting System (SOCIB), the Balearic Islands Port Authority, and the State Meteorological Agency (AEMET).
